Brown County Court December Term. A.D. 1849, There was the execution of the foregoing deed, by all the bargainers except John G. Gaskins present in open court and in due form of law by the oath of David S. Willis subscribing witness thereto Whereupon Frederick B. Latham Esquire one of the Justices comprising the court was appointed to take the private examination of Mary Powe wife of Willis Powe and Penelope Peter wife of William Peter parties to this deed as to their free consent in executing the same the said Mary and Penelope being here present in court, and the said Frederick B. Latham her respects to the court that he examined the said Mary Powe and Penelope Peter here in open court but separate and apart from their said several husbands in which said examinations taken was after said the said Mary and Penelope did each of them declare admit and acknowledge that their assent to the execution of this deed was not given under the fear controul or compulsion of their said several husbands or of any other power but of their own free will and consent and that they and each of them do now assent to the execution thereof, Ordered that said deed be registered. This Indenture made and executed on this day of September A.D. one thousand eight hundred and forty nine between Lewis Heath of the first part and James Overitt of the other part, all of the County of Brown and State of North Carolina, Whereas it is found and in consideration of the sum of One hundred Dollars to the said Heath in hand paid by the said James Overitt the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and do by these presents grant bargain and sell unto the said James Overitt his heirs and assigns one half of a certain undivided tract of land in the aforesaid County and State in the North side of Pease river and East side of the Great Swatope adjoining the lands of Enoch Overitt, Thos. Ewell and others coexisting of three hundred acres granted to Harmon Gaskins one dated April 26, 1791. The other dated September 13, 1757, another granted to William Beesley dated September 26, 1753. To have and to hold the aforesaid granted premises the improvements privileges and appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining thereunto, to him the said James Overitt his heirs and assigns forever, the said Lewis Heath do hereby agree to and with the said James Overitt that he will forever warrant and defend the right and title of the said lands against the lawful claims of any and all persons whatever, in testimony the said Lewis Heath do hereunto affix his hand and seal date above written signed sealed and delivered in presence of C.
