Banks and her children and the increase of their portion and also in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to me paid by my said daughter Susan A. Banks at and before the sealing and delivery here of the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have loaned unto my said daughter Susan A. Banks during her natural life the following negroes and their increase to wit Caroline and Melia, and after her death I give the said negroes to her children with all their increase. To have and to hold the above named negroes and their increase unto the said Susan A. Banks and her children their executors and administrators forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st day of August 1846.

Residing however my life estate in said negroes.

This Indenture made and executed by and between Aaron Jeyner of the one part and Enoch Buck of the other part, both of the County of Craven and State of North Carolina. Witnesseth that he the said Aaron Jeyner for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Dollars and seventy five cents to him in hand paid at or before the sealing signing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto him the said Enoch Buck his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying in the County aforesaid on the North side of Siler river and North side of Mount Pleasant and South side of Poplar branch bounded as follows, beginning at a corner of the John Shirts patent and runs up and with the edge of said Mount Pleasant swamp to a corner of said Shirts patent then along the given line of the same to 46th East 22 poles to a small pine then to the first station containing seven acres be the same more or less, To have and to hold the above mentioned tract of land with all the benefits and privileges therunto belonging, And he the said Aaron Jeyner heirs and assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend the aforesaid tract of land unto him the said Enoch Buck his heirs and assigns forever with the exception of the use and privilege and the benefits of said tract of land during the natural life time of my Buck mother of said Enoch Buck, In testimony whereof he the said Aaron Jeyner have hereunto set his hand and seal this 5th day of March.
